In our 43rd year of operation, we are thrilled to report that we served more families than ever

before in our organization's history. A record 1,019 families stayed with us in 2023. These families, navigating challenging times, sought comfort and care as their children received medical treatment at Mayo Clinic. Our doors remained open to offer a home away from home, a haven where families found solace, supported by our dedicated staff, volunteers, and fellow families on similar journeys.

Those families were provided with nearly 14,000 nights of free lodging, another mission delivery record last year. Combine the lodging with the 12,000 meals we provided, and families were able to save more than \$2.3 million in additional medical treatment expenses they would've incurred had the Ronald McDonald House not been an option.

Our impact extends beyond a room and nutritional support though. Last year, more than 7,500 individuals of all ages were supported by our Family Activities programming. Supporting our families through day-to-day programing, and so much that we do in the House, was made possible by the incredible support of our volunteers, who collectively contributed nearly 13,000 hours of their time in 2023.

None of these accomplishments would have been possible without the unwavering support of our donors. Thousands of individuals, like yourself, generously contributed to our cause, demonstrating a shared commitment to making a difference in the lives of the children and families we serve. We are humbled and grateful to be entrusted with the support of wonderful donors.

Thank you for being an integral part of our journey and for making a difference in the lives of those we serve. Together, we are giving families a priceless gift - the ability to stay close when it matters most.



# **Barb Henoch: Leaving a Legacy**

### "The meaning of life is to find your gift. The purpose in life is to give it away."

Since 1980, and its beginnings as a 12-bedroom hospitality house, Ronald McDonald House Charities Midwest MN, WI, IA, has provided a home away from home and given support to families seeking medical care for their children at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.

For more than 30 years of the House's existence, Barb Henoch was a constant - a beacon of steadfast resolution and faithfulness. Her love for the House shined bright, only to be outshined by her love for the children and families who walked through its doors.

After relocating to Rochester in the early 1990s, Barb - in collaboration with her second husband, McDonald's owner/operator Phil Henoch - helped the organization grow and mature. Their efforts changed the trajectory of the Ronald McDonald House; an impact that continues to this day.

Once the House was officially part of Ronald McDonald House Charities, it built a 24-room House on 2nd St. SW, only one block from Mayo Clinic's Saint Marys Campus, where many children are treated. Barb, along with the Board of Trustees, other volunteers, and

community members and businesses, raised \$2.2 million for construction costs.

Nine years later, the House expanded to 42 guest rooms total, including six rooms specifically designed for long-term stays. Barb was once again crucial to the organization's expansion.

When RMHC Midwest MN, WI, IA moved forward with the ambitious goal of expanding to 70 guest rooms, Barb led the way, as the honorary co-chair for the Love Tremendously Hope Exceedingly capital campaign.

In 2019, when the dream was realized, Barb was sitting front row as children and families cut the ribbon for the largest Ronald McDonald House in the state of Minnesota, and one of the largest in the world.

Beyond her support as a fundraiser and an advocate, Barb was a mainstay at House events, like the Hearts & Diamonds Spectacular and the Swing Your Birdie Golf Classic.

But volunteering at the House was her passion. She loved being the support for guests after long days at the hospital, and she wanted others to discover a love for it as well.

In 2007, Barb established a scholarship for volunteers who are working towards furthering their education or professional background at a college, university, or technical school. Over the past 17 years, 16 individuals have received \$1,000 gifts to help them reach their goals.

Additionally, when the 2019 expansion opened, Barb financially supported the creation of the Volunteer Nourishment Center; a relaxing space to *fill the cups* of those who are pouring into the children and families at the House every day.

Barb passed away on Feb. 17, 2024, at the age of 94. Although she no longer greets the guests at the House...they will forever feel her love.

While I only had the privilege of knowing her during my current tenure as CEO, many guest families, volunteers, and staff members have known her for 5, 10, 20 years, and more. The Ronald McDonald House was blessed with Barb's presence and support for more than three decades; the legacy she left will continue to impact children and families for years to come."


